CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT

On behalf of Crossroads North Argyll, I am delighted to present our Annual Report for 2019/2020.

It certainly has been a very busy year. We have supported 46 unpaid carers and cared-for. Over the past year we have supported 26 new unpaid carers who have been referred to us by North Argyll Carers Centre after they have completed an adult carers support plan.

We work in Partnership to help support unpaid carers throughout Oban, Lorn and the Isles. Our main partner is North Argyll Carers Centre. We also work closely with the Dementia Team at the hospital.

Joan, our Manager also attends the Frailty Group, which is a multi-disciplinary team approach based at Lorn Medical Centre. This includes GPs, District Nurses, Practice Nurses, Physiotherapists, Occupational Therapists, Social Workers, Pharmacists, Healthy Options, North Argyll Carers Centre and Crossroads North Argyll. This Group is successful in helping to reduce duplication, but raises patients' needs for support and to ensure the relevant support is put in at the right time.

The Board and Staff met last May(2019) for a development day. The day was a great success with both staff and board members finding it good fun and very informative. The day covered Staff and Board Members getting to know each other better through interactive games, information on the running/financing of Crossroads, how we see the organisation now and how we see it in the future.

We have had one new person joining the board in January 2020, Lorraine King who has extensive experience of working with third sector organisations and applying for funding.

We also have a new member of staff this year, Agnes Ingram joined us in October. Agnes has a lot of experience in supporting people who are in a caring role and vulnerable adults. We welcome both to Crossroads North Argyll.

We now have 10 Care Attendants covering a very large area.

The Board and staff held an emergency meeting at Rockfield Centre in March 2020, to discuss the new pandemic and how we would take things forward to support unpaid carers. We agreed to make the difficult decision to cease all face-to-face support with immediate affect and move to providing support by telephone. All unpaid carers were informed and were happy with the decision, as they were very wary of letting people come into their homes.

I am very proud to be part of a superb team, with dedicated staff and committed board members, who support me and help to develop Crossroads North Argyll. A heartfelt thanks to all.

We attended our first Charities Day in June 2019. We had a great day out. Many thanks to staff and board members for donating the items for the tombola.





KEY DEVELOPMENTS & PROJECTS

Monday Group 2019 – 2020

This project commenced in August 2019 after it was highlighted that there was a need in our community to support Carers. In consultation with the identified beneficiaries of the service the majority of them wished to visit the surrounding area which they had been unable to do due to their caring roles over the past few years. Some had also lost touch with friends and family and were isolated from social contact leading to feelings of loneliness and in some cases depression.

Over the past 18 months we have made many interesting visits including:

Poppies Garden Centre and Tearoom, Cruachan Visitor Centre, Oban War and Peace Museum, Kilmelford Hotel, Slate Islands Heritage Centre - Seil Island, The Oyster Bar – Seil Island, The Creagan Inn, A trip on the CalMac ferry to the Isle of Mull, The Ocean Explorer Centre at Dunbeg, The Barn Bar at Lerags, Ben Lora Café at Benderloch



There have been an average of 6/7 clients attending with 2 Care Support Staff and the benefits of this service has been invaluable. The Carers are collected from their homes and this allows them to attend the group. This project has helped to break down some of the isolation that the Carers feel at times. They have greatly benefitted from sharing their experiences, making friends with other Carers and getting peer support, who understand what each other are going through. The Carers have also said that they have received support for themselves in many different ways including from the Support Staff and the Manager of the Project.

Feedback from Carers:

"I love meeting with other Carers each week for a blether as they know what I am going through".

"I like getting picked up from home, as sometimes I wouldn't go if I had to get the bus".

The Monday Support Group is funded through Argyll and Bute Council's Supporting Communities Fund and the Edward Gostling Foundation.
